The Symbols of Lent: The Coins

Today we lay before the cross the bag of coins, reward for treachery toward the Son of God.







Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on us. We blame Judas for his greed, his selfishness, but excuse our own. We too are grasping and self-seeking. In the shadow of your cross we cry, "Have mercy on us."



While Judas sought payment for unfaithfulness,

Jesus died in faithfulness. In his life and death

he became the bread broken for us, the blood poured out for us. Jesus freely offers to all who hunger and thirst the eternal nourishment of his very self.



Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on us. At times we too live unfaithfully. We spend our money for that which is not bread; we labor for that which does not satisfy. In the shadow of your cross we cry, "Have mercy on us."



Let us pray together,

O God, whose glory it is always to have mercy: We look at Jesus, and we look at ourselves, and we confess the great difference. **Truly your ways are higher than our ways,** and your thoughts than our thoughts! **Forgive our unfaithfulness; conform us to his** love.

your grace abundantly pardons and transforms us!

woman at the well, as we pray together saying, Lord in your mercy, hear our prayers, Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayers.

Bless and inspire all who lead us in faith and share your holy Word, especially Revs. Taunya, Jerry and Bill, and our entire lay ministry team.
